

Observation Behavior Descriptions

On Task: The student is considered to be on task when their eyes are on the person speaking, and/or the task at hand such as a text book or white board.

Following Instructions: If an instruction is given to the student and/or class, the student is considered to be following the instruction if they do what is being asked within 5-10 seconds of the request.

Raise Hand to Speak: If the student raises their hand and waits to be called on before speaking a positive mark is recorded. The student is considered to be talking out any time they are talking without permission.

Accepting Correction: The student is considered to be accepting correction in a positive manner any time the teacher asks them to change their behavior and they do so right away without negative comments and/or negative body language such as sticking out tongue or walking away.
